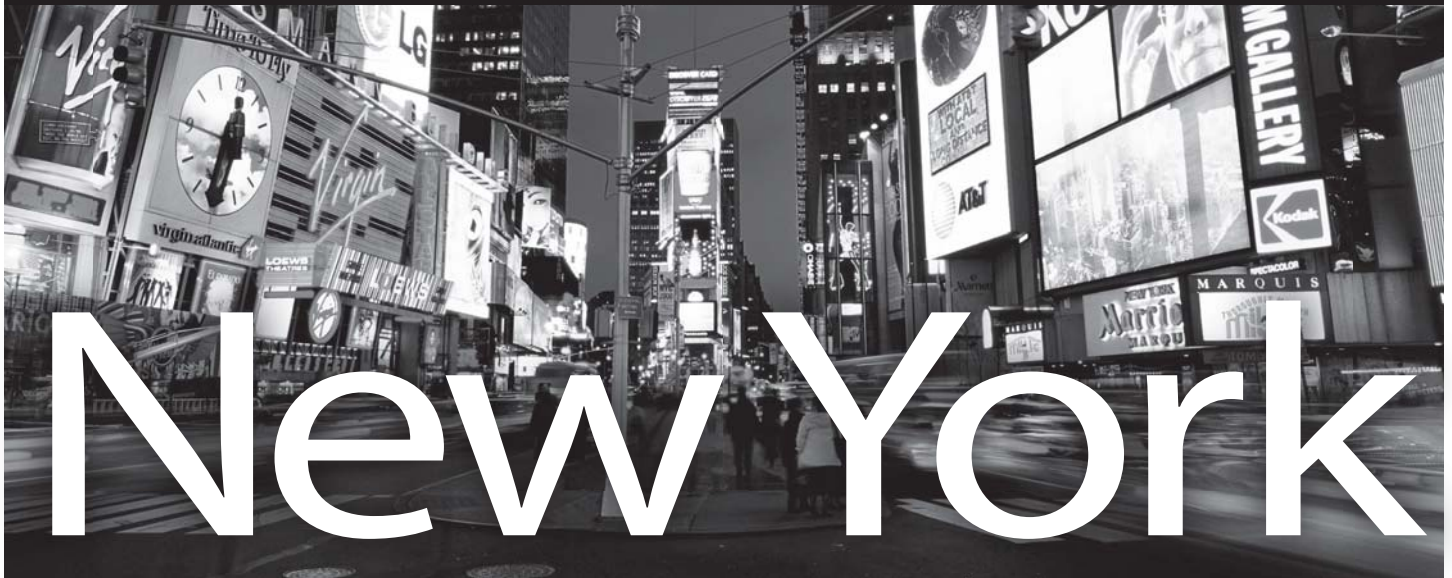


# The One You've Been Waiting For
